

TSA compliance opens new paths for Securidox

Securidox's unique electronic booking confirmations and boarding passes are now available to airlines flying to and from the USA with the assurance that the technology behind the system, is now fully compliant with TSA standards.

This means that the barcodes printed in the boarding passes generated by Securidox can be read by the CAT/BPSS* machines used at TSA security checkpoints in American airports.

Data from scanned boarding passes is compared both electronically and by security personnel with information from passenger ID – ensuring travel documents are legitimate and have not been tampered with.

In addition to incorporating this technology into the system, Securidox also announced extensions to their client content management system - Manage&Control™ - that will offer improved security and monitoring options to airlines. Users will now be able to control private keys, administering as many as are required for different periods, departure points or times of day.

"It is important that our clients have the ability to manage all aspects of the documents and are empowered to ensure that their documentation is always current and of the highest quality possible".
